➤ **From the Library:** I am fond of dictionaries and this week I have reviewed two. The first one is the *Oxford Concise History of the Christian Church* (2nd edition revised) and has been edited by F A Livingstone. It is based on the highly acclaimed Oxford Dictionary of the Christian Church which is in its third edition. This dictionary is an abridged version of the third edition and contains over 5 000 condensed and accessible entries. It provides coverage of theology, patristic scholarship, churches and denominations, the Church calendar and organization and the Bible, as well as entries on theologians, musicians, and writers of religious work.

- It updates and reflects recent changes in Church organization around the world;
- Geographical coverage now includes Latin America.
- The topics covered include Liberation Theology and the ordination of women.

This book is in the Reference Section of the Library and cannot be issued but can be consulted here. [270 LIV]

The second dictionary is the Oxford dictionary of Saints by David Farmer. Pope John Paul II canonized Crispin of Viterbo, a nineteenth century Capuchin in 1982 and he is included in this edition of the book. In all Pope John Paul II canonized 111 saints, some of them with companions of him. One of these was Teofano Venard and 111 companions and these people are not listed in Farmer's volume. This highly acclaimed dictionary provides wide and insightful coverage of the lives, cults and artistic associations of over 1700 saints, ranging from the famous to the obscure, the academic to the uneducated, and the rich to the poor. Informative and entertainingly written, it is an indispensable source for both specialists and readers
